Anyone who has travelled in Southeast Asia cannot but be intrigued by the spirit house shrines that are everywhere – in houses, gardens, shops and businesses. The spirit house - intended to provide a shelter for spirits - is normally in the form of a miniature house or temple, and is mounted on a pillar or on a dais. In this workshop you will make a 3D pop-up spirit house from paper. There are no folds – the whole structure (comprising over thirty separate parts) is made from hinges and dovetails joints and will fold down flat.
